ADOPTING POLICIES

Our partners are adopting lasting policies to support cancer prevention amongst their staff, youth, and visitors.

PRACTICING PREVENTION

SUN SAFETY

- Encouraging all to wear hats, sunscreen, and protective clothing when outside
- Installing sunscreen dispensers to provide free sunscreen
- Adding shade protection while enjoying outdoor spaces

SCREENINGS

Promoting cancer screenings through worksite wellness

AWARENESS

- Installing signs with reminders about cancer prevention
- Raising awareness that the HPV vaccine is cancer prevention
- Providing cancer prevention education to staff, youth, and visitors

The Impact of COVID-19:

The COVID-19 pandemic drastically altered the work of CPiA during year 2, just as momentum for cancer prevention efforts was gaining traction. In the midst of a major public health crisis, it was difficult to keep attention on CPiA, maintain the partnerships, and engage in the community.

St. Mary's Healthcare found creative ways to continue CPiA efforts, including shifting to online education, virtual meetings, and socially distant interactions.
